may 17 2016 there are more children in school today than ever  
before for example in 1950 the average level of schooling in  
africa was less than two years it is more than five years today  
in east asia and the pacific the schooling of the population went  
from two to seven years between 1950 and 2010 jan 16 2017  
how does a child s experience at two years old translate into  
being a fulfilled productive adult research shows that the  
learning gap between advantaged and disadvantaged children  
can show up as early as nine months of age a study showed  
that by age three children of low income families had half the  
vocabulary of more advantaged families what s more nearly  
one in three children under age five in the philippines is stunted  
a key marker of undernutrition this rate is high for the country s  
level of income this paper provides the first detailed  
multivariate analysis of potential drivers of stunting in the

philippines using data from the 2015 national nutrition survey  
feb 14 2020 in 2015 on average women first marry at the age  
of 24 and men at 27 it varies across regions south asia has the  
lowest age of first marriage for both women and men 20 and  
25 respectively europe and central asia has the highest 27 for  
women and 30 for men aug 5 2015 today about 2 3 of the  
world s population lives in asia a figure dominated by india and  
china looking at the regional breakdown of the forecasts we  
see that by 2100 africa and asia will be home to 4 4 and 4 9  
billion individuals respectively and will together account for 83  
of the world s population nov 11 2013 you can see that in japan  
about 78 78 000 out of 100 000 female newborns survive up to  
age 80 whereas about 7 6 500 out of 100 000 female  
newborns survive up to that age in sierra leone life expectancy  
at birth for females was 47 years in sierra leone and 86 years  
in japan for the same period sep 22 2020 4 one way to close  
the gender gap is through skills training such as technical
